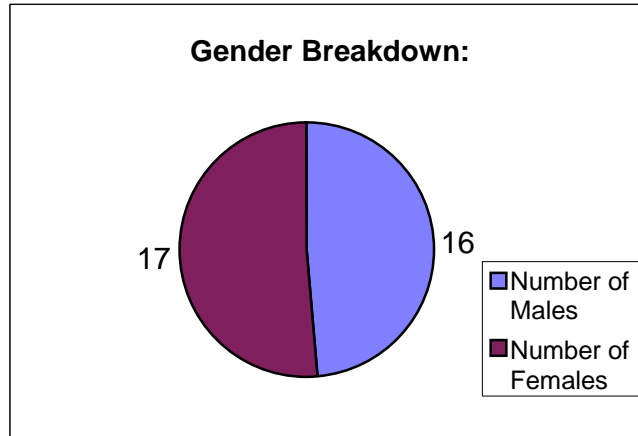

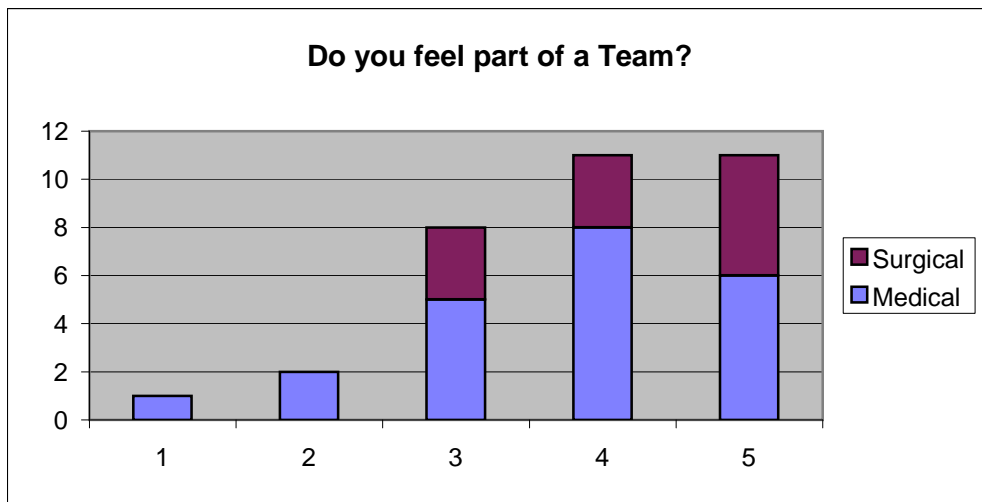

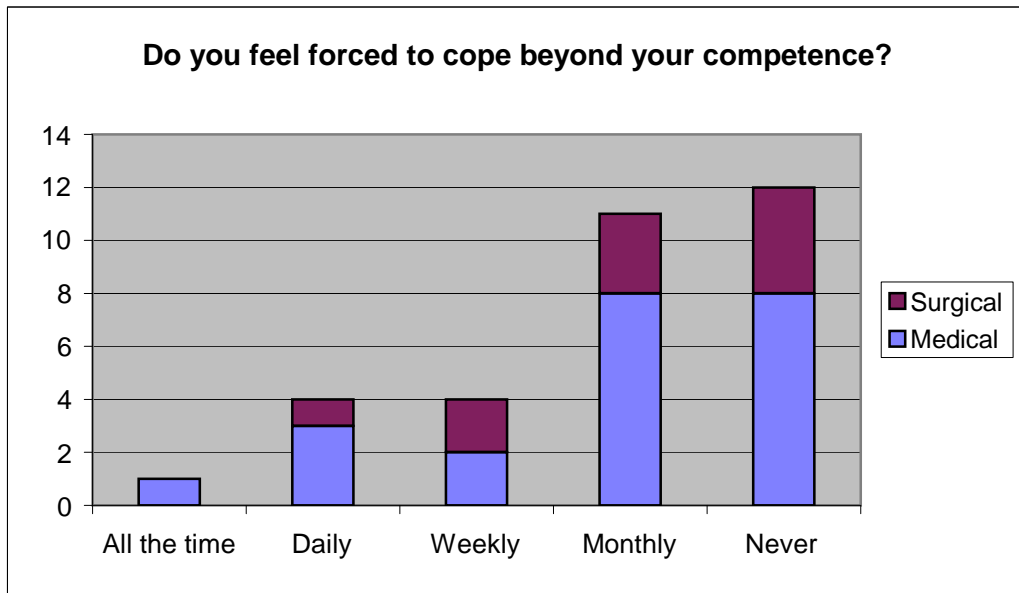
Type of F1 post at present Medical Surgical

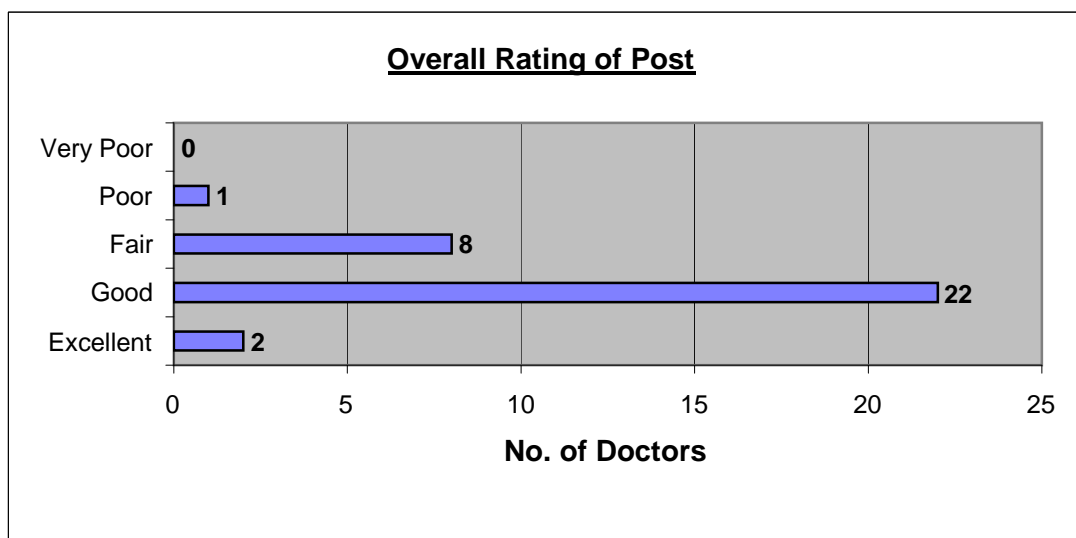
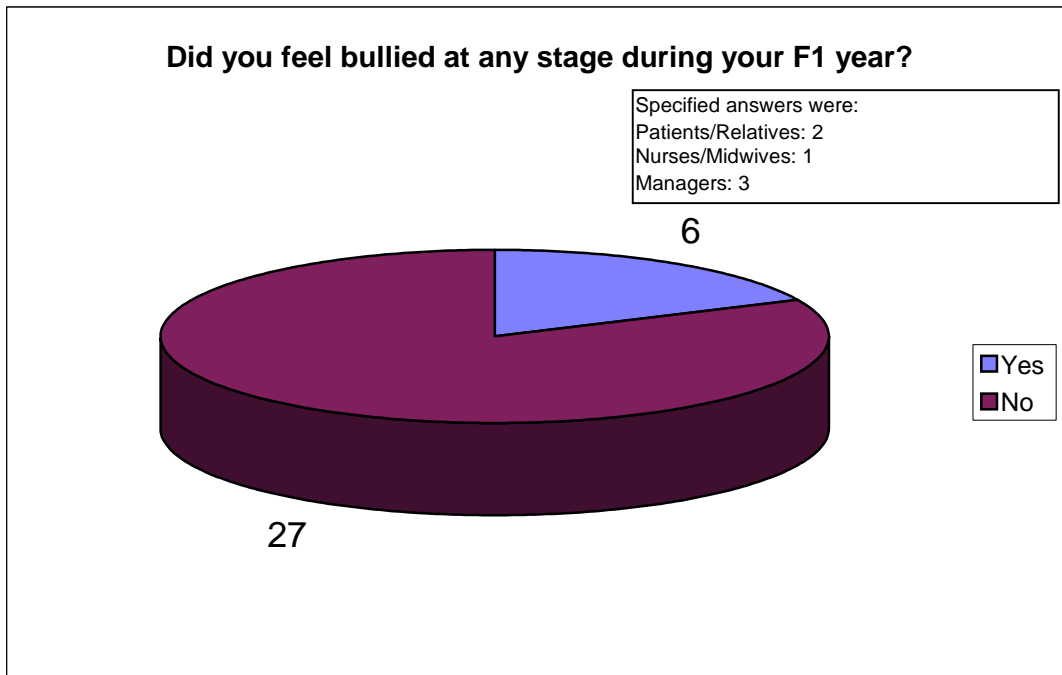

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Educational Experience Improvements

Less bleeps more time dedicated to teaching

COMMENTS:

Foundation Programme is really good giving us opportunities to get experience in a variety of fields and helps us to choose a career.

I think Foundation Programme give us more supervised learning facilities and more input into the career plans and ways of attaining through structured programme. I would like to have more teaching sessions with much better supervision and training of clinical skills.

Thoroughly enjoyed my time. I felt there were plenty of teaching opportunities and formal e.g. PRHO tutorial sessions and teaching sessions.

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I am considering a medical future in a part-time capacity. Shifts are long and tiring. Reading journals, text books etc (in addition to time spent trying to understand what has been required of me under the foundation programme) leaves little time for other things e.g. family and friends. It seems that to "do medicine well" it must be to the detriment of other things. I have found the communication from NIMDTA conflicting on occasions i.e. the information from Sheffield. Having my GP attachment changed was a little frustrating. I had told family and friends/colleagues I was going somewhere and then it was changed, with thanks. I feel the time provided for the return of this questionnaire as unsatisfactory. (I have recently been on nights).

Foundation Programme very poorly organised. We have been given very little information about run through training. No-One is sure about what is happening after F2.
