# **Overview**

This Prospectus is designed to provide an overview of training jobs in Psychiatry in Northern Ireland. There is information on each of the Psychiatric Specialties from the Training Programme Directors. There is also Trust specific information including educational and training opportunities. This Prospectus will provide useful information to help Psychiatry trainees make the most of training placements and help map their career path. It may be beneficial for FY2 or GP trainees who have placements in Psychiatry. It will also guide those who are new to the specialty or new to training in Northern Ireland.

The Prospectus was produced along with a Training Information Leaflet as a result of the NIMDTA Placement Quality (PQ) Review of Psychiatry Training in 2019. The PQ process aims to improve training posts within Northern Ireland by engaging with trainees, trainers and providers to develop and implement strategies to improve current practice. The results of the 2019 review were overwhelmingly positive with 71% of psychiatry trainees reporting that their placement was of excellent or good quality as a training post. The majority of trainees across NI reported that they would like additional information about the available posts to help with placement preferencing. This Prospectus addresses this issue and provides the additional information requested by trainees.

# Foundation Year 2 Trainees in Psychiatry

Approximately one third of FY2 trainees will have a 4 month post in a psychiatry placement. This is beneficial for future medical careers both in Psychiatry and other specialties. FY2 trainees will have placements in Outpatient, Inpatient Psychiatry or a mixture of both. Trainees will be able to develop skills in mental state examination and assessment, management of psychotropic mediations and risk assessment. They can also develop transferrable skills in communication, team work, and leadership and will have the opportunity to be involved in quality improvement and audit. FY2 trainees will have protected time to attend mandatory generic skills sessions at NIMDTA and will have appropriate supervision by senior colleagues.

#### **GP** Trainees in Psychiatry

GP trainees can have a 4 or 6 month training post in Psychiatry. These posts are extremely beneficial for a career in General Practice as a large proportion of this work is the promotion of good mental health and treatment of mental illness. Trainees will be able to develop similar skills as above and also achieve specific learning outcomes in their curriculum such as the ability to:

- *"Diagnose, investigate and manage mental health conditions using history, examination, support, management and referral where appropriate.*
- Communicate effectively, professionally and sensitively with patients, relatives and carers, recognising potential difficulties in communicating with people with mental health conditions and the importance of generating and maintaining rapport
- Assess risk to make the patient's safety and the safety of yourself and others a priority." RCGP Curriculum

GP trainees will have protected time to attend mandatory GP Training Days.

Both FY2 and GP trainees will be encouraged to consider completing the Diploma in Mental Health at QUB and efforts will be made to facilitate attendance at classes for this.

# **Opportunities for trainees**

#### Academic Psychiatry

There are fabulous opportunities to get involved in academic psychiatry in NI, both teaching and research.

Joint appointment posts with QUB are one way to get experience and therefore develop academic skills that are vital for all psychiatrists. For trainees wishing to gain experience in research, or indeed with an interest in pursuing an academic career, this post can provide an excellent first step in this journey. There are 3 JA posts which are half clinical and half academic. There will be the opportunity to get involved in undergraduate teaching. For those with a particular interest in research there will be projects you can become involved in. It is useful to consider your own areas of interest prior to starting the post as research can take time!

Interest in these posts can be indicated on the post preference forms sent out through NIMDTA. They are recommended for core or higher trainees, but it is advised that both written papers have been passed. Depending on the level of interest, a brief informal interview process may take place.

Academic Clinical Lecturer (ACL) post is normally for 3 years and can be appointed to a trainee with an existing training number who have already completed a PhD. Fellowship (ACF) is spans 2 years. It is expected that the trainee will be working towards applying for a PhD during this time.



# **Belfast Trust**

Mental Health services in the Belfast Trust provide mental health and intellectual disability services for children and adults in the Belfast area and provides a number of regional specialist services for Northern Ireland.

# **Acute Services:**

#### Home Treatment

The Home Treatment Team sees patients who are acutely unwell who would otherwise be admitted to hospital. It consists of 3 consultant psychiatrists and a specialty doctor.

#### Unscheduled Care

The Unscheduled Care Team deals with urgent referrals, largely from the Emergency Department and also from GPs and FMOs. The team consists of nursing staff, a team manager, an associate specialist and a consultant. They are based at Fairview at the Mater Hospital, and cover all the Trust acute hospital sites.

#### Hospital Liaison

The General Hospital Liaison Team sees patients from the Trust general hospital wards that require psychiatric input. This is a smaller team, based in the RVH and consists of a general adult consultant, old age consultant and a liaison nurse.

# **Outpatient Opportunities:**

# Primary Mental Health

There are 4 core multi-disciplinary teams based in the North, South, East and West sectors of Belfast. The teams help adults aged between 18 and 65 who have mental illnesses which impact their ability to function such as depression and anxiety. They promote and support mental wellbeing through brief interventions such as anxiety management, psychoeducation, behaviour activation and CBT, supported by medications if needed.

#### **Recovery Services**

There are 4 core multi-disciplinary teams based in the North, South, East and West sectors of Belfast. They provide treatment for patients with severe and enduring mental illness. In addition to this there is a Rehabilitation and Resettlement Team and an Early Intervention Team (EIT). The EIT provides a holistic care approach to young adults experiencing first episode psychosis and working closely with families and carers as part of the treatment

programme. The service includes access to a range of interventions, which include family work, group work and medical treatment.

#### <u>Old Age</u>

The Psychiatry of Old Age (POA) services specialize in the assessment and management of mental illness associated with the ageing process. The service sees the majority of patients with dementia in the Belfast Trust, elderly people with functional illness and provides community, specialist dementia, liaison and acute inpatient care.

There is a specialist Community Mental Health team for Older People and single point of referral for Belfast based at Knockbracken Healthcare Park which is similar to that for General Adult Psychiatry.

#### Department of Psychotherapy

The Department of Psychotherapy is based in Shimna, KHCP. It provides time-limited talking therapies delivered either in groups or on an individual basis depending on clinical needs and available options.

There are opportunities to learn about how psychoanalytic theory can be applied in many areas of psychiatric practice, about other forms of evidence based therapies such as Cognitive Behavioural Therapy and Interpersonal Psychotherapy. Furthermore, discrete pieces of working with the Gender Identity Service, Self-Harm Team and Eating Disorders Service may be arranged by request in advance.

These placements are well suited to psychologically minded trainees later in their core training years and who may be considering Higher Training in Medical Psychotherapy, but equally those who wish to develop their interests to complement other training.

#### Forensic Psychiatry

Shannon Clinic is supported by the four Community Forensic Mental Health Teams across the region who each deliver services to their respective Trust population. The rationale for community forensic teams is to support the transition from secure care into the community. Patients suitable for referral to the community forensic team are usually (but not exclusively) between the ages of eighteen and sixty-five, currently suffering from a mental disorder and who require a forensic service on the basis of either (i) risk, (ii) specialist need or (iii) continuity of care. The service also provides advice/guidance to referring agents where the level of risk is not clearly defined but there are ongoing concerns.

# Duty Bleep Arrangements

- One trainee co-ordinates the duty doctor rota for AMHIC
- The working week is split into 10 sessions; AM and PM
- Each trainee will cover a regular session, Wednesdays and Fridays are allocated on a rolling rota basis (to allow for attendance at educational sessions)
- There is a duty phone which is held by trainees from 9am to 5pm
- The duty doctor also holds an emergency pager that will be triggered in the event of an emergency (such as a cardiac arrest) or a safety alert including nurses carrying out a restraint
- After 5pm and during the weekend the 1st on-call carries the emergency pager and the wards will be able to contact the doctor on their mobile phone through the Trust switchboard

# Handover Arrangements

Handover between first on call doctors should take place in the AMHIC Education Suite. It has been the expectation to date that if the doctor covering the Unit after 5pm is working off site as part of their 'day' job, the doctor should leave in good time to arrive at the Unit for handover at 4.50pm

AMHIC Handover times are as follows: Monday – Sunday morning: 9am Monday – Friday evening: 4.50pm Monday – Sunday night: 9pm

Those covering Beechcroft/Muckamore have a telephone handover at 9am on weekends

Second on call should attend weekend Unscheduled Care Team handover at 0815 and 2030 at Ward 2B Office, RVH to discuss OOH USCT referrals and assessments.

# Rota

- 1. 1<sup>st</sup> On-Call
  - o The first on-call rota contains long days and night shifts
  - There are 3 different shifts based on areas covered including AMHIC, KHCP, Beechcroft, Muckamore and USCT
  - o The rota is currently under review
- 2. 2<sup>nd</sup> On-Call
  - Second on-call is non-resident on-call and will be contacted by switchboard for the Belfast Area
  - They are required to attend morning and evening USCT handovers at weekend and bank holidays

FY2 and GP trainees are encouraged to complete the Diploma of Mental Health at QUB and will be granted Wednesday afternoons to attend these sessions

The academic programme takes place on a Friday morning. There is a timetable for consultant teams to do journal club or case presentations and there is the opportunity for trainees to present. There are also relevant staff and service updates provided at these sessions.

There are opportunities to teach medical students as part of their 4<sup>th</sup> year attachments and higher trainees can apply for the Junior Teaching Fellow Role.

# **Training Opportunities:**

- Modified Electroconvulsive Therapy takes place in the Mater Hospital on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 9am. The ECT team is based in Ward 1 of the Unit led by DCN Alfie Atrura. The Consultant lead is Dr Turkington.
- Each trainee will receive Management of Actual or Potential Aggression (MAPA) training at the beginning of their placement, if they have not done so within the last year.

# Northern Trust

The Northern Health and Social Care Trust was formed on 1 April 2007 from Homefirst Community Trust (a community Trust), United Hospitals Trust (an acute Trust), and Causeway HSS Trust (an integrated acute and community Trust). It serves a population of approx. 440,000 people and covers the former district councils of Newtownabbey, Larne, Carrickfergus, Antrim, Ballymena, Magherafelt, Cookstown, Coleraine, Ballymoney and Ballycastle.

Holywell Hospital has three Adult Acute Inpatient Units which includes care for those aged 65+. There are two Psychiatry Intensive Care Units (male and female), one Dementia Care ward, One Addiction Unit and one Rehab Unit. Other on-site services include Home Treatment Teams, Intellectual Disability services, Forensic Services, Eating Disorder Services, STEP (Psychosis Prevention) and the Personality Disorder service. The RTU is an Adult Acute Inpatient Unit.

ECT occurs on Tuesday and Friday mornings In Holywell. A rota is circulated for psychiatry trainees to attend ECT during their placement. GP / F2 trainees are welcome to attend.


# **Educational Opportunities**

# Acute Sites & peripheral units:

- Ulster Hospital
  - The Ulster Hospital is located in Dundonald, approximately 5 miles from Belfast. Ward 27 is the inpatient mental health ward.
- Lagan Valley Hospital
  - Lagan Valley Hospital is located in Lisburn. There are 2 inpatient wards, Ward 11 (>65) and Ward 12. A Home Treatment Team, Mental Health Assessment Centre, Community Mental Health Teams and Outpatient clinics also operate from the Lagan Valley Hospital site.
- Downe / Downshire Hospital
  - The Downe and Downshire Hospital are located in Downpatrick, approximately 23 miles from Belfast. The Mental Health Inpatient Unit and Dementia Assessment Unit are in the Downe Hospital, with Ward 15 (addictions) and Ward 27/PICU on the Downshire Hospital Site. Trainees may undertake outpatient clinics in the Downe Hospital, and have the opportunity to observe or be involved in administering ECT which also takes place in the Downe. There is an education suite at the Downe Hospital which trainees have access to.
- Ards Hospital
  - Ards Hospital is in Newtownards, located 5 miles from the Ulster Hospital. Mental Health Outpatients is on this site, where trainees will undertake outpatient clinics under the supervision of consultants. The Home Treatment Team and Acute Day Treatment are based in Lough House. Community Mental Health Teams and the Mental Health Assessment Centre are based in McQueen Home.
- Finneston House
  - Finneston House is located opposite the Downshire Hospital site. Community Mental Health Teams, the Mental Health Assessment Centre and the Home Treatment Team are based here.

# **Outpatient opportunities:**

Trainees will have the opportunity to undertake outpatient clinics, seeing patients for both new patient assessments and review appointments under the supervision of their consultant. They also may be involved in Community Mental Health Team meetings and Enhanced Care Planning meetings.

# Teaching

#### Protected training time:

- All trainees have 1 hour protected supervision with their clinical supervisor on a weekly basis.
- GP Trainees and F2s are encouraged to take part in the Diploma in Mental Health which is run through Queen's University, Belfast. This takes place on Wednesday afternoons.
- Core Trainees have protected training time to attend the Introduction to Psychotherapy course and MRCPsych teaching on a weekly basis (Wednesday am / pm).
- GP Trainees have protected training time to attend GP teaching days.

# Trust teaching:

Friday morning – A weekly Academic Meeting takes place in Downshire Hospital for all medical staff. This provides opportunities for trainees to present case presentations, journal presentations and audit or quality improvement projects. <u>Educational Opportunities:</u>

- A Reflective Practice Group is held in Downshire Hospital for all trainees on Friday mornings. Higher trainees have the opportunity to co-facilitate this group along with Consultant Clinical Psychologist.
- Fourth year medical students rotate through each site within the Trust, giving trainees the opportunity to participate in undergraduate teaching.
- The Trust is keen to support trainees who are undertaking postgraduate examinations and as such will endeavour to approve study leave for examinations / courses / conferences where possible.



# Brief description of inpatient units:

#### Bluestone Unit

- Located at Craigavon Area Hospital site as a separate building
- Provides inpatient treatment for those with severe mental health problems requiring treatment that cannot be provided in the community.
- Patients are assigned to one of 4 wards usually on the basis of address and age:
  - Bronte Craigavon & Banbridge
  - Cloughmore Newry & Mourne
  - Silverwood Armagh & Dungannon
  - Willows over 65 year olds
  - o Dorsy unit Intellectual disability inpatient unit
  - Rosebrook Psychiatry Intensive Care Unit

#### St Luke's Hospital site

- Located in Armagh and contains Gillis dementia inpatient assessment unit in addition to a number of outpatient and community facilities

# **Outpatient opportunities:**

#### <u>Acute:</u>

Home Treatment Crisis Response Team

- 3 teams covering 3 different localities: Armagh and Dungannon, Craigavon and Banbridge and Newry and Mourne.
- Provide intensive home treatment and high level support to adults experiencing severe mental health problems who would otherwise be admitted to hospital.
- Provide Home Treatment and Crisis Response from 9am-9pm and Crisis Response and ED Liaison from 9pm-9am 7 days per week.

#### Integrated Liaison service

- Interface between general acute care and psychiatric departments
- Core team works 9am-5pm 7 days per weeks on both the Craigavon Area Hospital and Daisy Hill hospital sites
- Long day F2/GPST/CT provides out-of-hours cover for this service between 5pm-9pm and the Home Treatment Crisis Response Team after 9pm.
- Based in the Liaison office on the Craigavon Area Hospital site.

#### Primary Mental Health Care Services

- Outpatient care for a range of psychiatric illness for a limited period of time.
- 3 teams covering the 3 different localities: Armagh & Dungannon, Craigavon & Banbridge and Newry & Mourne.
- Multidisciplinary Team including a Consultant Psychiatrist.
- They offer a wide range of interventions including brief psychological interventions, CBT and medication management.
- The majority of patients attending this service will have mild to moderate, non-complex mental illness e.g. anxiety disorders and depression.
- Working hours: 9am-5pm (Monday-Friday).

#### Support and Recovery service

- Outpatient care for chronic, complex and/or severe mental health problems, primarily bipolar affective disorder, schizophrenia or severe depression.
- 3 teams covering the 3 localities: Armagh& Dungannon, Craigavon & Banbridge and Newry & Mourne.
- Multidisciplinary Team including a Consultant Psychiatrist which can provide intensive longer term input for patients with significant mental health needs often involving multiple services.
- Working hours: 9am-5pm (Monday-Friday).

#### Addictions Service

- Outpatient treatment and can access inpatient beds in relation to drug and alcohol addictions.
- They provide substitute prescribing for opiate dependence.
- St Luke's Hospital, Armagh site.

#### Psychiatry of Old Age service

- 3 teams covering the 3 localities: Armagh & Dungannon, Craigavon & Banbridge and Newry & Mourne.
- Multidisciplinary Team, including a Consultant Psychiatrist who provides community based support for people over the age of 65 years and experiencing a mental illness, diagnosing dementia and supporting people living with dementia and their carers.

#### Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS)

- Mental Health assessment and treatment to young people up to 18 years of age.
- 3 teams covering the 3 localities: Armagh & Dungannon at South Tyrone Hospital, Craigavon & Banbridge at Bocombra Lodge and Newry & Mourne at Daisy Hill Hospital.



# Acute Sites & peripheral units:

There are three main sites in the Western Trust:

- Grangewood on the Gransha site in Derry in the Northern sector
- The Tyrone and Fermanagh Hospital in Omagh
- Keyworkers Accommodation in the South West Acute Hospital (outpatient only) in the Southern sector.

# Brief description of inpatient units:

The Tyrone and Fermanagh Hospital consists of Elm and Lime ward, female and male admissions respectively. It is a 26 bedded unit with 4 enhanced care beds. There is a home treatment/crisis team in both Omagh and Enniskillen with a step down/alternative to hospital admission through Rathview house, a 6 bedded unit in Omagh. In Grangewood, the crisis team, acute day hospital and inpatient services operate under the one roof with the opportunity to step up or step down from hospital with either day hospital or treatment at home.

# **Outpatient opportunities:**

There are outpatient Recovery and Primary Care Liaison teams in:

- Omagh
- Enniskillen
- Limavady
- Strabane
- Derry Cityside
- Derry Waterside

There are also Psychological Therapies Teams based in:

- Dawson house in Derry
- Erne House in Omagh
- The Aisling Centre in Enniskillen

# Specialist services within this placement:

- The Trust has a half time Community Forensics team
- There is a Personality Disorder Service based in Dawson House which covers both Northern and Southern sectors of the Trust
- There is a nurse led Eating Disorder Service
- The community Addictions Team covers both Northern and Southern sectors of the Trust with outpatient clinics in Enniskillen, Omagh (Asha centre) and Woodlea House (Gransha site-Derry). There is an 8 bedded inpatient detox unit in Omagh, Asha centre providing detox and stabilisation for patients referred in by the community teams and the wards.
- Psychiatric Liaison teams are currently being developed in Altnagelvin and the SWAH.
